We are such diverse creatures. We are creatures of habit and yet, we are able to step outside of that *mode* and live radically creatively – different than our normal MO – Modus Operandi.

My wife and I have friends who regularly live out their traditions ... faithfully. In special seasons of the year, they gravitate toward one of their regular habits. Are these practices GOOD traditions or are they simply (not so good) knee-jerk actions because *that's what they always do*? Well, it all depends, doesn't it, on the tradition. If it's a *bad* tradition, then, no, it wouldn't be good if they continued in it. BUT, if it's a *good* tradition, then, YES, absolutely, it's a good habit to be retained, especially when, all things considered – Counsel of God's Word included – it seems right. So what is their *tradition*?

They always, in loving care for their mom, go to her little place in the care home where she lives and amazingly decorate her room in ways reflecting the current season. This precious care is especially extended during the Christmas and Easter seasons. Their acts of love are amazing; their mom's place looks amazing. Pondering it all, it's amazing. Did I mention: *it's amazing*?

It's transcendently amazing how our heavenly Father manifests His love toward us through His Son and His Spirit. He is SO generous in *decorating* our lives. He is SO present as we simply seek His face and as we take new and exciting next steps in walk with Him.

Is this not one expression of INTIMACY with God? Yes, amen, it is, though it's difficult to sufficiently describe through written (or spoken) words. Lord God Most High, THANK YOU for being willing to adopt us into Your glorious family. What grace, what goodness, what amazing love.
